- A statement that highlights the applicant's credibility as an educator or serves as an endorsement for the Global Teacher Prize.

2. Any supporting evidence of official and/or public recognition of your achievements: Public recognition occurs when your contributions or achievements are acknowledged by an authoritative source, such as governments, educational institutions, community groups, NGOs, or international organizations like the UN. It can also include media appearances, where you're recognised as a spokesperson for a specific issue or cause.

3. Additional documents: Please attach any photos or URLs to support your application if you wish to.

PLEASE NOTE:

- A maximum of 10 files in total can be uploaded with your entry. These can be text, image, audio or video files.
- Text and image/photo files: each file can be a maximum of 2 pages. Please do not include links on the documents as they will not be considered.
- You can upload JPEG or PDF files (we also accept other formats). Maximum file size is 5MB per piece.
- Video and audio files may be hosted on a video site such as YouTube and should be no longer than 2 minutes recording time.
- Provide website URLs to the publicly accessible campaign or active URL of a landing page. Please ensure any applicable usernames and passwords are provided and active.
- Please refrain from uploading any additional answers to the questions, as they will not be reviewed or considered by the judges. All responses should be submitted within the 'Application Question' section.
